### SURGICAL

**Halima** lives in a small village in Tanzania with her niece. About five years ago, Halima started going blind. She developed bilateral cataracts, and felt totally dependent on her niece.

Even little things like getting out of bed became very difficult for her. She became completely blind. Halima told our team she felt like she was in a deep sleep, waiting to be woken up. She felt horrible because her niece had to pause her schooling to help her.

**“I just want to be independent again. I was my whole life, but now I feel useless.”**

Halima's nightmare ended when **she received a charitable surgery from our team**. Finally free from her burdens, Halima can now be independent and her niece can return to school.

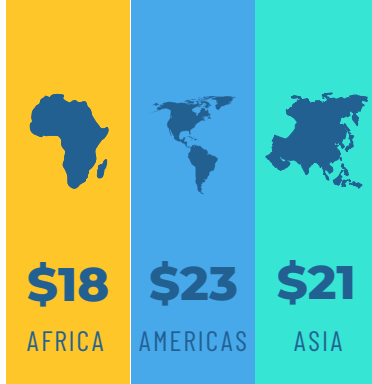

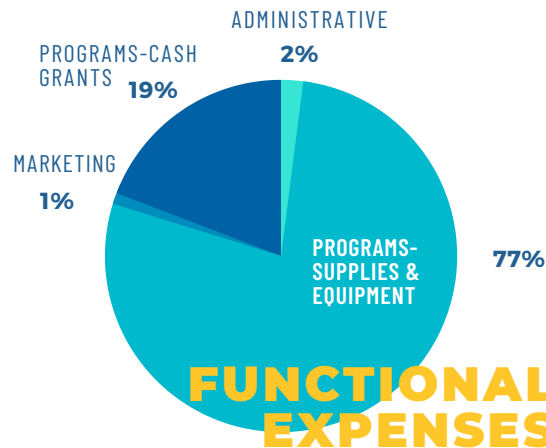
