




WHY VISION?



1 MILLIONTH PATIENT SEEN & SEEING

Almost 20 years ago, we struck a deal with a young and energetic Dr. Arun Sethi. He was eager to do charity work. We were eager to help him. We provided equipment and supplies. Dr. Sethi inspired other trained personnel to join him. After many years, thousands of outreach campaigns and the construction of our own four story state-of-the-art eye center, we have now screened or treated over 1,000,000 patients here in India. We thank Dr. Sethi and all those who helped us reach this great milestone.

(The one millionth patient was Gupti Patel, a 38 year old farmer with an infection in his right eye. If left untreated he would have lost the use of his eye altogether.)

PONSETI

We've been involved in the treatment of club feet since the very beginning. Many suffering from this abnormality are left to beg and are shunned by society. Dr. Ponseti and the University of lowa developed a procedure that can correct this condition in a matter of months without surgery. Dr. Bill Jackson recently visited the University of lowa and has become an expert in this procedure. Using the Ponseti method will heal hearts as well as deformities.

PROJECT

With generous donations from the Sabin Children's Foundation, LDS Charities and with proceeds from our Country Western BBQ last summer, we were able to fund our \$400,000 African Vision Project. This effort will consist of eight new vision projects throughout Africa. We will provide the needed supplies and equipment to develop community outreach in each of the countries of our new partners. This project will eventually yield 20,000 surgeries each year in Africa alone.









On July 18th we bade a heartielt farewell to a special lady. She bravely faced the insidious challenges of A.L.S. (Lou Gehrig's Disease) for almost a year.

Audrey was born on April 25, 1935 in Nurray, Utah - the 8th child of Thomas and Mahel King. Eventually her family settled in Mesa, Arizsna where she spent most of her growing up years. She attended Brigham Young University where she met and married her husband, Edward William Jackson. A few months after their westding in the Mesa, Arizsna temple, they moved to Washington, D.C. where William completed his degree at George Washington Medical School.

After medical school, Audrey, Bill and their three young children relocated to Southern California. Three more children foliowed and they spent the next 25 years raising their family in the beautiful Ojal Valley. During this time Audrey opened her home and became mother to children from Afghanistan, the Navajo Nation, Bolivia, the Philippines, Australia and the United States. Being around family and friends was one of Audrey's greatest joys. Novie night with proposom and milicipalses was a family favorite!

Together with her husband, she helped establish the Deseret International Foundation, now CharityVision. Because of her vision over 300,000 charitable surgeries were performed throughout the world for the lame, the blind, and the disligured. Always willing to travel wherever the need was greatest, Audrey successfully made temporary homes in such places as Algeria, Chana, Honduras, Kenya and Afghanistan. She was not only an angel of mercy to thousands, but she was the "heart" of the foundation. Her caring for others was sincere and personal. Thousands homer her name and look to her as a role model. Her passion for life, her love and dedication to family and her unselfish service will be greatly missed.
